Thrussington	Thrussington is a small village which originated as a Danish settlement on the western side of the River Wreake. The village is a thriving community of approximately 550 residents, and has a school, shop, hairdresser and two public houses. Melton Mowbray	The Borough of Melton nestles in the heart of rural Leicestershire, and encompasses the picturesque Vale of Belvoir, which, literally translated, means 'beautiful view'. Steeped in rural tradition, this part of the country is famous for its fine food and drink, including Melton Mowbray Pork Pies, Stilton cheese and locally brewed ale. Queniborough	Queniborough is located 7 miles northeast of Leicester on the Melton Mowbray road. The village has a school, shops, a post office and two public houses. The village church is St Mary's	www.queniborough.leicestershireparishcouncils.org
Syston	In Victorian times Syston was a busy cattle dealing town. There is still evidence of the late 18th century development in its conservation area around the parish church of St. Peter.
